Activity Idea

Parenting Top Tip

What is communication development of a child?

Communication development for young children includes

gaining the skills to understand and to express thoughts, feelings, and information.

Understanding communication begins before birth (during pregnancy) and continues through life, as a child hears, sees, and interprets information from other people. Below are some examples of games and playtime activities that integrate language learning with fun:
