Mathematics:

During our practical maths sessions, we will be learning to:

- develop our subitising skills for numbers within and beyond 5, and increasing connect quantities to numerals.
- explore night and day, sequencing events and use language related to time, including days of the week.
- complete and create our own ABB and ABBC patterns.

Literacy:

This half term we will continue to introduce the Little Wandle Phase 3 sounds during our daily phonics lessons. We will learn to recognise more tricky words and begin to build on our blending skills.

The child will take part in 3 adult led reading practice sessions a week. These will focus on fluency, prosody and comprehension. The children will also have the opportunity to take a weekly library book home, which we encourage you to share.

Reading books - Friday*

Reading:

To begin to read multi-syllabic words.

To recognise and identify phase 3 sounds.

Read a few common exception words (tricky words) matched to the Little Wandle Phonics programme.

Reads words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending

Writing:

I can write labels

Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sounds with letter/s

Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense.

Write each letter correctly when following a model.

Physical Development

PE – Gymnastics

This half term we will:

- Use scissors to cut out shapes with straight sides.
- Develop their core strength and stability to support with writing development.
- Form recognisable letters.
- Cut out simple shapes

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This term our PSHE topic is ‘Me and My World’. We will identify ways that we can show kindness to others. We will learn skills which will help us share our toys and resources with others.
