### **Agreement for Children**

To help me do well at school I will do my best to:

- ✓ Be creative, courageous, curious and compassionate;
- ✓ Follow the school dress code and bring any equipment I will need;
- ✓ Work hard and be proud of what I can achieve;
- ✓ Show respect to everyone in my school community;
- ✓ Keep to the Explorers' Code and behave in a way that allows everyone to learn;
- Come to school regularly (except when I am ill) and be on time;
- Do my homework on time and bring it back to school;
- ✓ Tell an adult if I am worried about something;
- ✓ If I have access to social media, I will follow the school rules and use the THINK rule before I post anything. (Is it True? Helpful? Inspiring? Necessary? Kind?)

## **Agreement for Parents/carers**

To help my child at school, I will do my best to:

- ✓ Encourage my child to do his/ her best and be positive about school;
- ✓ Attend parent consultations to discuss my child's progress;
- Ensure my child wears appropriate clothing to school and brings any equipment he/ she may need;
- ✓ Work with my child and support the school to encourage and maintain good behaviour;
- Make sure my child attends every day and on time, avoiding taking holiday during term-time;
- ✓ Try to support my child with homework and listen to him/ her read;
- ✓ Let the school know of any problems that may affect my child's ability to learn or their behaviour at school;
- Make direct contact (in person or by phone, email or letter, rather than via social media) with the appropriate person at school if I am concerned about my child or an aspect of school life;
- ✓ Follow the school's Social Media Policy.
- Abide by the parent and visitor code of conduct.

### **Agreement for the School**

Staff at the school will do their best to:

- ✓ Nurture children as individuals and help them recognise what they have to offer as members of society;
- ✓ Motivate and inspire children to achieve the highest standards in basic skills;
- ✓ Ensure children have the opportunity to achieve in all areas of learning and excel in those in which they have a passion or talent;
- ✓ Provide children with memorable learning experiences;
- ✓ Give children opportunities to develop their creativity, courage, curiosity and compassion;
- ✓ Contact parents if we are concerned about their child's attendance, behaviour or learning;
- ✓ Set and monitor home learning tasks in keeping with the school's homework policy;
- ✓ Treat parents/ carers as partners in their children's education, listening and responding to any concerns, keeping them informed about their child's learning and progress and consulting with them about their views;
- ✓ Follow the school's Social Media Policy;
- Implement policies which ensure everyone in the school community is kept safe, and treated with discretion and respect, both in person and online.
