Vocabulary:

- River: a moving body of water that drains the land.
- Evaporation: the process that changes liquid water to water vapor (gas)
- Condensation: the process by which water vapor transforms into liquid form
- Precipitation: water released from the clouds in the form of rain, hail, sleet or snow
- Infiltration: the process of water moving through soil and rock layers that make up the Earth's surface, to be stored as groundwater
- Mouth: the place where a river enters a lake, larger river, or the ocean
- Meander: when water flows in a curved manner
- Floodplain: an area of flat land beside a river
- Flood: when water overflows onto dry land
- Tributary: a freshwater
 stream that flows into a larger
