Fiction: The Little Red Hen (Vocabulary – mill, wheat, hungry, selfish, grind)

Non-Fiction: Instructions on how to find the little red hen and the ingredients (Vocabulary – left, right, forwards, next to, behind, in front)

Poem: Firework Night

Expressive Art and Design:

I am an illustrator — Experiment with lines of different thickness and tone whilst designing a fairy-tale scene

I am a baker – Experiment with quantities to make bread

I am a performer – I can develop a storyline into my play

I am a musician – I can move in time to music

Communication and Language

We will learn how to express ourselves effectively, showing awareness of listeners' needs. We will begin to talk about our past and identify changes over time.

I can retell my favourite story

I am a good listener

Mathematics:

During our practical maths sessions, we will be learning to:

- use 1:1 correspondence and begin to develop the language of 'whole' and develop the skills to understand that the last number in the count tells us 'how many'.
- use positional and directional language when creating and using maps to find the Little Red Hen.
- identify common 2D shapes.
- explore language related to capacity when making a trap for the fox.
- order and compare the fairytale characters by size and shape.

Physical Development:

In Physical Development sessions children will learn fundamental skills such as rolling and kicking a ball, gymnastics, and dance.

This half term we will:

- Practice copying shapes that have multiple movements e.g. X
- Hold scissors comfortably to cut straight lines Developing strength in arms to pivot from shoulder, elbow and then wrist
- Use tripod grasp for more intricate tasks

PE Days – Wednesdays and Thursdays

Literacy:

This half term we will continue to introduce the Little Wandle Phase 2 sounds during our daily phonics lessons. We will learn to recognise more tricky words and begin to build on our blending skills. The children will now be taking home simple CVC word story books. The child will take part in 3 adult led reading practice sessions a week. These will focus on fluency, prosody and comprehension. The children will also have the opportunity to take a weekly library book home, which we encourage you to share.

Book changing days: Reading books - Friday

Reading

Blends sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter – sounds correspondence.

Discussing the characters, settings and story structure of texts Innovating stories and creating our own stories

This term our PSHE topic is 'Family and Friends' and 'Beginning and Belonging'. We will recognise people who are special to us and identify why. We will explore the reasons friends might fall out and find suitable solutions.
