Dinky Doors Competition

Deadline - 28th Feb

Inspired by the dinky doors project in Cambridge. Children can use cardboard and craft materials to create a mini-door that represents a book. For instance, a little wardrobe to represent Narnia, or a wooden door that opens up to show the Gruffalo hiding behind it.

We will then place these around the school for the whole of book week- children will be able to see if they can find every door and guess all the stories that they were inspired by. Please note, doors should be no bigger than A4 - or they will be too easy to find! Completed doors need to be brought to the library no later than **28**th **February.**
