

## Ideas for Spelling Practise

### Sand

Write words in a tray of sand, rice or salt



### Chalks

Use chalks on a chalkboard, fence or on the pavement.



### Magic painting

On a dry day, use a paintbrush and a bucket of water to paint words on the pavement or an external wall. Watch them dry and then start again!



### Movement

Use your arms then just your finger to trace the words in the air, on the wall or on someone else's back. Can they tell you the word they are spelling?



### Playdough

Can they use the playdough to spell out their words?



### Scrabble tiles

Use scrabble tiles to spell out the words. How many points does your word score?



## Ideas for Spelling Practise

### Word hunt

Use a highlighter and an old newspaper to look for your spelling words of the week. How many times did you find them? Which words came up most?



### Syllables

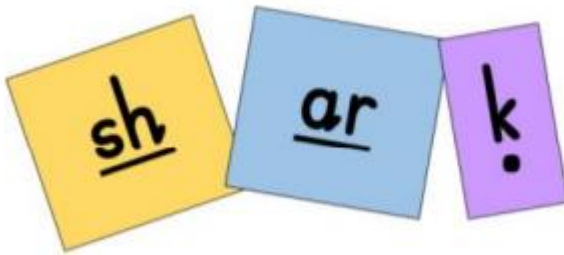
Break your spelling words into their syllables. Which one has the most? Least?

### Word mountain
